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## **Scheduled Electrical Interruption Saturday for Feeder 6B Customers on St. Thomas**

St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands (Dec. 5, 2025)— The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority (“WAPA” or “the Authority”) is informing the public of a scheduled electrical service interruption affecting Feeder 6B on Saturday, December 6, 2025, between 5:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.

This planned outage will allow crews to safely perform essential maintenance near Moravian School and will affect approximately 1,459 customers in the following areas:

- Gamble Gade
- Borger Gade
- Honduras
- Altona
- Demarara
- Kronprindsens Gade
- Dronningens Gade
- Commandant Gade
- Lucinda Millin Home

WAPA appreciates the public’s understanding as crews work to complete this important maintenance safely and efficiently.

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**About WAPA:** The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority is an autonomous agency of the Virgin Islands Government which produces and distributes electricity and drinking water to residential and commercial customers in the territory. WAPA was created by the Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands in 1964 through Act No. 1248. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through smart grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.
