

Scheduled Service Interruption for Portions of Feeder 9C - Friday, June 6

St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands (June 5, 2025) — The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority ("WAPA" or "the Authority") advises customers of a scheduled electrical service interruption on Friday, June 6, 2025, from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., affecting approximately 1,864 customers on Feeder 9C.

Areas impacted include Nadir, Frydenhoj, Nazareth, and Red Hook Airport.

This outage is necessary to allow WAPA crews to safely replace a damaged utility pole and complete critical infrastructure work in the area.

WAPA appreciates the community's understanding and patience as we work to enhance the reliability and safety of the electrical grid.

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About WAPA: The Virgin Islands Water and Power Authority is an autonomous agency of the Virgin Islands Government which produces and distributes electricity and drinking water to residential and commercial customers in the territory. WAPA was created by the Fifth Legislature of the Virgin Islands in 1964 through Act No. 1248. Today, WAPA generates electrical power at production plants on St. Thomas and St. Croix and distributes electrical service through barrat grids to customers on St. Thomas, St. Croix, St. John, Hassel Island, and Water Island. Potable water is distributed to almost 13,000 customers through water lines and standpipes. WAPA also has the responsibility of installing and maintaining streetlights.

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
